

Sam Wallace, Ph.D. LPC: Sam has worked with youth with sexual behavior problems since 1999 and adults who have offended sexually since 2005. He currently is in private practice in Fayetteville, AR and also works as a part time surveyor for The Joint Commission. Sam provides evaluation and treatment for a variety of mental health problems and is trained in EMDR. He has served as an expert witness in both state and federal court and provides sex offender evaluations for the federal defender's office and federal probation office for the Western District of Arkansas. He is an ad hoc reviewer for the Journal of Child Sexual Abuse and The Journal of Aggression, Maltreatment and Trauma. Sam is a research and clinical member of ATSA and current Treasurer for AR-ATSA, and past president of AR-ATSA.

Assessment of Dynamic Risks in Adult Offenders with the Stable 2007: The Stable 2007 is a third generation risk assessment tool that identifies dynamic intervention or treatment targets. The Stable 2007 assessment allows the user to reliably rank sexual offenders from those that are the lowest risk to reoffend to those that are highest risk to reoffend. Additionally, the Stable 2007 helps the user determine whether a sexual offender they are supervising/monitoring or assessing is getting more dangerous or less dangerous over time. This session will provide an overview of the domain areas and assessed and basic scoring methods including case examples.

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FEATURED SPEAKER



Michael H. Miner, Ph.D., L.P. is Professor of Family Medicine and Community Health and Research Director for the Program in Human Sexuality at the University of Minnesota. He began his work in sex offender research as the experimental psychologist for California’s Sex Offender Treatment and Evaluation Project and since joining the Program in Human Sexuality, his research has focused on the etiology of sexual abuse perpetration in adolescence, risk assessment, and sexual compulsivity. Dr. Miner coordinated adult sex offender treatment at PHS until 2008 and currently coordinates forensic assessment services. He

is immediate Past President of the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers and past Vice President of the International Association for the Treatment of Sexual Offenders. Dr. Miner is on the editorial board of *Archives of Sex Research* and past Associate Editor of *Sexual Abuse: A Journal of Research and Treatment*. He has been the editor, along with Dr. Eli Coleman, of two books: *Sexual Offender Treatment: Biopsychosocial Perspectives* and *Sex Offender Treatment: Accomplishments, Challenges, and Future Directions*, and an editor of *International Perspectives on the Assessment and Treatment of Sexual Offenders*. He was also guest editor for a special issue of *Sexual Abuse: A Journal of Research and Treatment* entitled “Treatment Outcome Research.” Dr. Miner has published numerous articles and book chapters on sex offender treatment, forensic assessment, instrument development, and evaluation methodology.

Skip Hoggard, LPE-I: Works at UAMS Family Treatment Program and ACH Adolescent Medicine; 20th year of therapy and assessment with adolescent population. 19 years of ASAP and Registration Risk Assessments. Specialty areas are adolescents with sexual behavior problems and adolescents with eating disorders. Lives in Little Rock with his wife and 2 dogs. One daughter (19) who is a college sophomore. Adolescent Brain Development and the Risk-Need-Responsivity Model: The Risk-Need-Responsivity Model of treatment for juveniles with sexual behavior problems is accepted in the field as one of the more cogent and applicable treatment models available. This presentation will endeavor to show how the process of brain development in adolescents fits neatly with the R-N-R treatment model, as well as summarizing some of the recent research findings.

Anh Đào Kolbe, LCSW is a social work therapist currently working at a residential treatment facility for adolescent sexual abusers. AĐK has been a social justice activist and mentor to at-risk youth for over thirty years. As a published photographer, AĐK uses their creative talents to educate others about privilege, oppression, and fragility.

Standards of Care for the Health of Transgender & Gender-Nonconforming People The goal of this session is to educate healthcare professionals on understanding how to provide services to the Transgender & Gender-Nonconforming individuals with dignity, integrity and competence.

Sheri J. Flynn, MS, LSW is currently the administrator of the Sex Offender Community Notification Assessment Program for the Arkansas Department of Correction and has been since May of 2000; however, she has been with the program since its inception in September 1999. She has been an adjunct professor in the Criminal Justice Department at the University of Arkansas Little Rock. She has been an adjunct professor at Phillips County Community College, University of Arkansas. She has worked for the Arkansas Department of Correction since June 1997.

J. Michael Wood, Ph.D. is the Supervising Psychologist for the Arkansas Department of Correction Sex Offender Community Notification Assessment Program, where he began working in 2000. He has received specialized training in research, assessment, and treatment of people with sexual behavior problems through his affiliation with the University of Memphis and the University of Tennessee Health Science Center, as well as at the Federal Correctional Complex in Butner, North Carolina. Dr. Wood is a licensed psychologist in Arkansas and a clinical and research member of ATSA, who also recently designated him as an ATSA Fellow for his contributions to the field. He has conducted various research projects and co-authored an article on Arkansas Internet sex offenders that was published in *Law and Human Behavior*, and peer reviews research manuscripts for the journal, *Aggression and Violent Behavior*.

Community Notification and the Importance of Individualized Assessment: There are many types of assessments for those convicted of sexual offenses. Dr. Wood and Ms. Flynn will discuss individualized assessment for the purposes of community notification and why the individualized approach is so important in terms of public safety. The presentation will explore the multifaceted assessment conducted by the Sex Offender Community Notification Assessment Program (SOCNA) and why risk assessment instruments alone are not enough to adequately provide the local law enforcement, probation/parole, the Arkansas Parole Board and the community with information needed to help offenders remain offense free.
